* Do remember that a pair on the board doesn't count towards your two pair! Post flop you can obviously also play these hands according to odds and outs, but do remember you usually need to discount more then with the hands in the SHC (mostly not with Axs though). Don't forget! =)

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Post flop

(if you need to bet more than ½ the pot: GO ALL-IN!)

Draw type	Flop	Turn
Weak draw (<6)	Almost always fold (unless last to act and proper odds)	Almost always fold (unless last to act and proper odds)
Mixed draw (6-8)	Check / Call according to pot odds. When drawing to a very strong hand you can also look at implied odds	Check / Call heads up. You can play aggressive if you're heads up and there's a scare card or you've got initiative.
Strong draw (8-12)	Check / Call since you don't want to isolate. If both opponents are inclined to call you, you should push. Play aggressively when you've got initiative (you're pre-flop raiser) or if you're heads-up	Check / Call. Heads-up you can play aggressively if he's capable of folding (a scare card here would be great!). Also when you've got initiative (you're the pre flop raiser) you can play aggressively
Monster draw (>12)	Like a made hand	Play aggressively, but still according to odds and outs



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
